Together, Lanse and Carina manage the commercial division of Fero and Son's Insurance with offices in Dunnellon, Beverly Hills and Ocala. They have 3 beautiful children – Mia, Jace and Brock.

The Fero Family are heavily involved with the Y in multiple ways. Their son, Brock started developmental swim lessons to ensure he was safe around the water. YMCA CAMP READERS

The Citrus Memorial Health Foundation YMCA received a \$10,000 grant from the Duke Energy Foundation to promote literacy while school is out. As part of a national YMCA initiative called Camp Readers, the Y is adding 30 minutes of reading to daily activities for kids to help prevent learning loss during out-of-school time. The donation from the Duke Energy Foundation helped provide a diverse selection of books, curriculum and literacy games to all of the Y campsites in Citrus County, serving 400 children this summer. The YMCA Camp Readers program helps to tackle summer learning loss by motivating youth to read for fun, build general reading skills, and increase their reading confidence when they are out of school. The Y provides kids in Citrus County with the opportunity to explore the outdoors, learn new skills, and make new friendships and memories. In addition to reading activities, swimming, crafts, and games. To ensure all youth have the chance to experience camp, the Y offers financial assistance through the People Helping People program to those in need of support.
